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WHAT IT TAKES TO STUDY THE BIBLE

1. **Salvation** (1 Corinthians 2:9-16)

The Holy Spirit is the one who will teach you and therefore you must be saved in order to fully understand the Bible (See lesson 1 for more information on this subject).

2. **A receptive heart** (Luke 8:1-15)

When you come to the words of God, you must come with a humble and teachable heart that is willing to submit to God's words as your final authority (Proverbs 3:5-6; James 4:7-10).

3. **Consistency in:**

- a. Prayer (ask God to teach you - Luke 18:1).
- b. Reading (1 Timothy 4:13) - Lack of consistency in Bible reading will lead to you not understanding what God desires you to see. Do not make excuses for not reading the Bible or you will regret it (Isaiah 29:9-16)!
- c. Study (Acts 17:11) - This means you will need to be willing to put some effort into learning the Bible (Ecclesiastes 12:12; 2 Timothy 2:15). You cannot be lazy and expect to learn the Bible.

4. Patience

When you get saved, you become a new born babe in Christ for you get born again (John 3:1-3; 2 Corinthians 5:17). Since you are a babe in Christ you are not going to understand everything someone who is older in Christ may understand. It takes time to learn things. You will need to be patient with yourself and the Lord. Drink the milk God has for you, grow in grace, and learn line upon line, here a little and there a little, and you will eventually move from milk to meat (Isaiah 28:9-10; Hebrews 5:12-14; 1 Peter 2:1-3).

5. Scepticism

You need to be a bit sceptical of people's comments about the Bible. Always check what someone says with the scriptures.

E.g. Be sceptical of notes in your Bible from the publisher. Those notes are only the words of men and not God. Thus, they are not always correct.

Do not believe everything you hear about the Bible. Instead, prove all things by the Bible and let God be true but every man a liar (Acts 17:10-11; Romans 3:4; 1 Thessalonians 5:21).

6. Resources (These are not absolutely needed but they can help).

a. An exhaustive Bible concordance:

I recommend Strong's Exhaustive Concordance of the Bible but there are many other good ones out there.

b. If you have a computer, a Bible program would be very beneficial.

Computer programs can be used to search for words, phrases, and cross references. Looking up similar passages will help you realise the Bible will interpret itself and thus learn that the greatest commentary on the Bible is the Bible. Two good computer programs are SwordSearcher and E-sword.

- SwordSearcher can be purchased from www.swordsearcher.com.
- E-sword can be obtained online for free.

HOW TO STUDY THE BIBLE

1. Pray over the passage (asking God to speak to you through His words).
2. Read the whole passage.
3. Meditate on the passage (Psalm 119:148).
4. Use a concordance to find similar passages that help to explain the passage you are reading.
5. Rightly divide the passage (2 Timothy 2:15). When rightly dividing a passage of scripture you need to do the following:
 - a. Consider the surrounding text. Always consider the context of every verse. Never take a verse out of its context. If you take a text out of its context, you will twist the Scriptures to your own destruction (e.g. Job 2:9). “A text without a context is a pretext.”
 - b. Remember each book was written at a specific time to a specific group of people for a specific reason.
 - c. Observe the passage by asking the following and writing down what you find:

- **Who?**

Who spoke it, who did they speak it to or who is it speaking about?

- **What?**

What is the passage trying to get across? What is the key verse in the passage? What do I learn about God, Christ, the Holy Spirit, human beings, and their responsibilities in this passage? What can I learn about relating to God from this passage? What can I learn about relating to others from this passage?

- **When?**

When is the passage speaking about?

- **Where?**

Where does the passage I am studying fit into God's timetable?

- **Why?**

Why does the speaker or writer say what they say? Did someone ask them a question and they responded to a question? Was the speaker addressing a problem? Was the speaker angry? Was the speaker being sarcastic? Was the speaker giving instruction?

- **How?**

How can I apply this to my life? Is there a command in this passage that I need to obey? Is there an example in this passage that I need to follow or not follow?

6. Take the plain literal meaning of a verse unless the context demands otherwise (Proverbs 8:8-9).

Sometimes the Bible speaks figurative or symbolic, but when it does, it either:

- a. Is written in such a way as to make obvious to the reader it is doing such (e.g. in Luke 13:31-32, Jesus did not think Herod was a literal furry four-footed animal but rather Herod had the attributes of a fox).

OR

- b. Uses such words as "like" or "as" (e.g. in 1 Peter 5:8, the devil is said to be walking about "as a roaring lion")

OR

- c. Defines the symbolism in the text (e.g. in Revelation 1:12-20, it defines the symbolic meaning of the seven stars and seven candlesticks for you).

You should never take a passage symbolic or figurative unless the Bible makes clear it is such. Rather, you should read the Bible according to the customary rules of grammar. That is, you are to read the Bible taking it literal, letting it say what it wants to say and not allegorising its words.

7. Avoid changing the passage because you do not like it, cannot understand it, it does not fit your beliefs, or etc.

The Bible is the written words of God and it is not to be tampered with (Deuteronomy 4:2; Proverbs 30:5-6).

The first sin committed by mankind was a result of changing the words of God (Genesis 3:1-6). Thus, at all cost, do not add to God's words and do not subtract from God's words. Instead, believe, practice, and proclaim God's words.

8. Get started. Do not procrastinate, begin today.

At the beginning of every lesson there will be a passage for you to study. For instance, in Lesson 1 you are told to study Romans 10:1-13. In Lesson 2 you are told to study Romans 8:28-39.

If you are studying through this book alone, then before proceeding with the lesson, use the previous mentioned guidelines and study the passage out thoroughly and then continue the lesson.

If you are using this book to teach someone else, there are several ways you can use this book:

- a. You could skip the passages you are told to study and simply lead the student through the lesson.

OR

- b. You could start each study session out by studying the passages together with your student before proceeding with the lesson.

OR

- c. You and your student could separately study each passage listed at the top of each lesson prior to coming together. Then, when you meet together to go over the lesson, discuss what God has taught each of you and then proceed with the lesson. For example, in lesson 1, both of you would study Romans 10:1-13 a few days before coming together to go over lesson 1. Once together, you would see what God taught each of you and then proceed with the lesson.

LESSONS TO STUDY

LESSON 1: SALVATION

Study: Romans 10:1-13

Introduction: The most important question you will ever be asked on this earth is “Do you know for sure you are going to heaven when you die?”

Therefore, the passage above and the lesson below are designed to teach you some basic truths on the great subject of being saved from the penalty of sin: THE LAKE OF FIRE.

1. God’s plan of salvation

a. To be saved one must know they are a sinner.

Psalm 51:3, 5 “For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me...Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me.”

Romans 3:10 “As it is written, there is none righteous, no, not one:”

Romans 3:23 “For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;”

Question 1. According to Romans 3:23, how many people have sinned and come short of the glory of God? _____

b. To be saved one must realise they are worthy of God's judgment and therefore helpless to save themselves.

📖 Romans 6:23 “For the wages of sin is death....”

Question 2. What does the word “wages” mean? _____

Question 3. What has the sinner earned? _____

📖 Revelation 21:8 “But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death.”

Question 4. According to God's standard, do we deserve to be cast into the lake of fire? _____

c. To be saved one must receive the gospel message.

📖 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 “Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain. For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:”

Question 5. According to 1 Corinthians 15, what is the gospel?

d. To be saved one must receive the Lord Jesus Christ as their personal Saviour (putting all their trust in what He did for them).

Acts 16:30-31 "...Sirs, what must I do to be saved? And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house."

Question 6. According to Acts 16:30-31, what do you need to do in order to be saved? _____

John 1:12-13 "But as many as received him (Christ), to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God."

Question 7. According to John 1:12-13, what must you do to become a son of God? _____

Romans 10:9-13 "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed. For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Question 8. According to Romans 10:9-13, what do you need to do in order to be saved? _____

2. Being saved changes things.

a. You get “born again” (John 1:11-13; 3:1-18).

At the moment you receive Christ, God becomes your Father. Feelings have nothing to do with this. If you do not feel saved, it does not change the fact of your birth.

b. You become a new creature in Christ!

📖 2 Corinthians 5:17 “Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.”

Thus, you should have new desires, new hopes, and new convictions, which will result in you desiring to live more righteously.

c. You receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

📖 Ephesians 1:13 “In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise,”

If you are saved, you have the Spirit of God in you. You do not need to wait for some special experience. You get the Holy Spirit the very moment you become a child of God. He lives within you (Romans 8:9 and 1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

d. Your sins are all forgiven!

All of your sins have been forgiven. The blood of Jesus has redeemed you, cleansing you from all sin forever!

Colossians 1:14 “In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins;”

Colossians 2:13 “And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath he quickened together with him, having forgiven you all trespasses;”

Psalms 103:10-12 “He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is his mercy toward them that fear him. As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us.”

Question 9. Name at least four things that happen when you get saved? _____

Conclusion: Salvation is simple, but it is only by grace (Romans 11:6; Ephesians 2:8-9) and only through the Lord Jesus Christ!

Acts 15:11 “But we believe that through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ we shall be saved, even as they.”

John 14:6 “Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.”

Acts 4:12 “Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.”

1 Timothy 2:4-6 “Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time.”

“Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift.”

(2 Corinthians 9:15)

LESSON 2: SECURITY OF THE BELIEVER

Study: Romans 8:28-39

Introduction: The Bible teaches conclusively a person who has put their faith on the Lord Jesus Christ for their salvation is safe and secure forever.

However, because men often try to make the scriptures fit their own ideas, some will teach you can lose your salvation.

As a true child of God you must “let God be true but every man a liar”. You must trust God more than anyone; including more than yourself (Proverbs 3:5).

May God use this lesson to help you get scripturally grounded in this important truth.

1. What saith the Scriptures?

John 10:27-30 “My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. I and my Father are one.”

Question 10. According to John 10:28, what does Jesus give his sheep?

Question 11. What does eternal mean? _____

Question 12. According to John 10:28, will Jesus' sheep ever perish?

Question 13. According to John 10:28, can any man pluck Jesus' sheep out of his hand? _____

In John 10:28, when the Bible uses the word "man" it means human (person).

After a person gets saved they are put into the hand of God and nobody (including themselves) can pluck them out of the safety of God's hands.

✚ Ephesians 1:11-13 "In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will: That we should be to the praise of his glory, who first trusted in Christ. In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise,"

Question 14. According to Ephesians 1:13, after you believe on Christ, what does the Holy Spirit do? _____

After you trust Christ to save your soul, your soul (the real you) is made perfect by the washing of the blood of Christ. You are then placed into the hand of God and sealed by the Holy Spirit until your body is changed to perfection like your soul. This keeps your soul sealed from sin and its effects. Therefore, in God's eyes, the real you (your soul) is completely perfect and sinless (1 John 3:9).

You are safe and secure in the hands of God for He is able to keep you clean.

2 Timothy 1:12 “For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day.”

Question 15. According to 2 Timothy 1:12, after the Christian commits their soul to Christ, who keeps their soul for them? _____

1 Peter 1:3-5 “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you, Who are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.”

Question 17. According to 1 Peter 1:3-5, who is kept by the power of God? _____

From the above, we can see very clearly that a person is saved by God and then kept by God.

Therefore, every child of God is safe and secure for all of eternity, praises be unto the King of kings for the great grace which He has bestowed upon us!

However, let us continue our study by addressing the issue of doubting your salvation.

2. What to do if you doubt your salvation.

- A. Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves and remember God cannot lie (2 Corinthians 13:5; Titus 1:1-2).

- B. Understand disobedience as a Christian can lead to a guilt which causes you to forget about God's eternal salvation. Thus, live clean, pure, and right before God and others and you will not doubt your salvation (2 Peter 1:1-9; 1 John 2:3).
- C. Remember assurance of salvation is actually faith in God and His word. This assuring faith grows stronger as you hear, read, study, and memorise the Bible (Romans 10:17).

Question 20. According to Romans 10:17, how do you get faith?

Note: Your salvation is not based on your feelings or emotions. What you should be concerned with is not how you feel but what He has already said.

Your feelings cannot change God's truth or your salvation.

3. Since God will not send a person who is saved to Hell, then how does God react to their sin?

1. The Holy Spirit will warn us we are doing wrong
2. God may use someone we know to rebuke us of our sins.

3. God may use the preacher to preach to us about our sin and its consequences.
4. If we do not listen to His rebukes He may chastise us by allowing us to lose our job, house, physical health, spiritual health, something/someone special to us, or maybe even our life (Hebrews 12:1-11; 1 Corinthians 5:1-5; 1 Corinthians 11:23-32).

We shall truly reap what we sow (Galatians 6:7-8).

Note: If any of point 4 happens in your life this does not necessarily mean God is correcting you. For sometimes these things happen for other reasons.

However, remember, the Lord will not let His children get away with sin. If you will not listen to Him speaking He will eventually start smacking. The only way to avoid this is to keep yourself right with God (1 Corinthians 11:31 and 1 John 1:9).

Conclusion: The moment you trusted Jesus Christ as your Saviour you were saved by faith; and it is faith that will keep you assured of your salvation.

Trust God and His word; live a holy, righteous life; and you will not have any trouble with doubting your salvation.

LESSON 3: SPEAKING TO GOD

Study: Matthew 6:5-15

Introduction: In order to have a good relationship with God, you must be a person of prayer. If you neglect the great privilege of daily prayer you are sure to grow cold to the things of God.

In this lesson we will study why we should pray, the way we should pray, what we should pray for, and things which will hinder our prayers from being answered.

1. Why we should pray?

- a. We should pray because Christ commanded us to pray (Luke 18:1; 1 Thessalonians 5:17).

Question 23. According to Luke 18:1, what does God say men ought always to do? _____

- b. We should pray because we need God's help to stay faithful (Matthew 26:41).

Question 24. According to Matthew 26:41, is our flesh weak? _____

- c. We should pray because it is powerful (2 Kings 20:1-6; James 5:16-18).

Question 25. According to 2 Kings 20:1-6, did Hezekiah's prayer change God's mind? _____

2. The way we should pray.

- a. We should pray with an earnest heart (James 5:16).

Question 26. According to James 5:16, what kind of prayer avails much? _____

- b. We should pray in whatever posture the Lord directs us to pray in.

There is not a certain posture you must pray in. In the Bible you will find people praying in many different postures, just to name a few:

- Kneeling (Ephesians 3:14)
 - Standing (1 Kings 8:22-23)
 - On their face (Genesis 17:3)
 - Looking up to heaven (Matthew 14:15-19)
- c. We should only pray through Jesus' name (John 15:16; Ephesians 2:13, 18; 1 Timothy 2:5).
 - d. We should pray with praise in our heart to God (Matthew 6:9, 13).

3. What we should pray for.

- a. We should pray for Jesus Christ to return soon (Matthew 6:10; Revelation 22:20).
- b. We should pray for God's will to be done in our lives (Matthew 6:10; Luke 22:42; 1 John 5:14-15).
- c. We should pray for God to provide our daily needs (Matthew 6:11; Luke 11:9-13).
- d. We should pray for God to forgive us of our sins (Matthew 6:12; 1 John 1:9).
- e. We should pray for God to protect us from temptations and troubles (Matthew 6:13; 26:41).
- f. We should pray for God to send forth labourers into his harvest (Matthew 9:37-38).

- g. We should pray for one another (James 5:16).
- h. We should pray for all men, kings, and for all that are in authority (1 Timothy 2:1-2).
- i. We should pray for the peace of Jerusalem (Psalm 122:6).
- j. We should pray about everything that concerns us (Philippians 4:6-7).
- k. We should pray over your food, thanking God for it (1 Timothy 4:1-5).

4. Things that will keep our prayers from getting answered.

- a. Our prayers will not get answered if we do not pray.

📖 James 4:2 “Ye lust, and have not: ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not.”

Question 27. According to James 4:2, why do we often not have what we desire? _____

- b. Our prayers will not be answered if we are asking with a selfish heart.

📖 James 4:3 “Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts.”

Question 28. According to James 4:3, what is wrong with a lot of prayers? _____

- c. Our prayers will not be answered if we do not believe God is going to answer them.

James 1:5-7 “If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord.”

Hebrews 11:6 “But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.”

Question 29. According to Hebrews 11:6, in order to please God, what must you have? _____

- d. Our prayers will not be answered if we are not asking for God’s will to be done.

1 John 5:13-15 “These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God. And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us: And if we know that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of him.”

Question 30. According to 1 John 5:14, when can we be sure God hears our prayers? _____

- e. Our prayers will not be answered if we have sin in our life.

Psalms 66:18 “If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me:”

Isaiah 59:1-2 “Behold, the LORD'S hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that it cannot hear: But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you, that he will not hear.”

Proverbs 28:9 “He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination.”

Question 31. According to Psalm 66:18, what could cause God not to hear our prayers? _____

- f. Our prayers will not be answered if we are treating other people wrong (Matthew 5:21-24; 1 Peter 3:7).

Question 32. According to 1 Peter 3:7, will God hear the prayers of a man that will not treat his wife properly? _____

Conclusion: Prayer is a great privilege which God has given us. It is a blessing to be able to talk with the God who made and saved us!

Yet, how sad it is, few of God's people are actively praying every day.

If you are to grow and enjoy the blessings which God has for you, then you must pray often.

For a believer to spend time with God is not only an unspeakable joy, but it is also a work that becomes a weapon of great power!

This lesson has only briefly discussed the great subject of prayer.

May you as a believer begin to learn more about prayer as you pray.

LESSON 4: SCRIPTURES OF GOD

Study: 2 Peter 1:13-21

See also 2 Timothy 3:12-17; 4:1-4

Introduction: The Bible is God’s holy word! Upon that statement lies the hope of all mankind. Without an absolute written authority from God Himself, there can be no discernment of right and wrong, truth or error, or knowledge of anything that God is or requires of man.

Without the Bible, man knows not where he came from, where he is, or where he is going. But thanks be unto the Lord for His written revelation He has given.

In the word of God, man finds the way to Heaven and the source for growth as a believer. If you as a Christian want to live right and grow, then the Bible must be your life and your guide!

The passages above and the statements below will help you better understand the word of God. May God lead you to read and understand it.

Study the following information on the Holy Scriptures:

1. The Scriptures are Perfect (Psalm 19:7-8).

2. You are not to add nor take away words from the Scriptures
(Deuteronomy 4:2; Proverbs 30:6; Revelation 22:18-19).

3. The Scriptures have been preserved for every generation
(Psalm 12:6-7; Isaiah 40:8; Matthew 24:35).

The Bible's preservation is like no other ancient book in the world. The Bible has been preserved by so many ancient manuscripts that the text is unquestionable to an honest inquirer.

It has been estimated that there are well over 35,000 ancient manuscripts and parts of manuscripts from all over the ancient world that support the Bible. Evidence upon evidence has stacked up that verifies beyond any doubt, that we have the Bible exactly as God originally gave it.

Question 36. According to Psalm 12:7, whom did David say would preserve the words of the Lord? _____

Note: In Psalm 12:6-7, the Bible states God would preserve His pure words for every generation. Thus, somewhere on this earth we have God's perfect, pure, and preserved words in print!

We know the Authorised King James Bible is God's words. We know this because it is the only Bible in the English language without proven error. All the rest have proven errors.

The King James Bible has been tried and proven for over 400 years!

It is the only English Bible with all of the following verses in it correctly: 1 Thessalonians 5:22; 1 John 3:16; 1 Timothy 6:10; 2 Timothy 2:15; James 5:16; and hundreds of other foundational verses.

Therefore, it is the only English Bible which could possibly be God's preserved word without error! I trust as a believer you will hold your Bible close to your heart and not let anyone shake your faith in its infallible contents.

4. **The Scriptures consistently and accurately prophesy the future** (Isaiah 46:9-10; John 13:19).

Question 37. According to Isaiah 46:9-10, God says that He is the only God and He proves it by telling the end from the beginning. What does that mean? _____

The Bible is like no other book in the world. The Bible has more than 800 prophecies. The mathematical probability of these prophecies coming to pass is less than 1 in 10 to the 895th power, and yet they come true.

There is no other religious book, textbook, science book, or literature anywhere that can even come close in comparison to the Bible's accuracy. Truly the Bible is a Book in its own category. It is God's Book!

The Bible specializes in prophecy from the first book (Genesis) to the last book (Revelation). There are literally hundreds of prophecies we could show you. The odds of these prophecies coming true are so astronomical that it is hard to fathom.

In a book entitled "Science Speaks", (pp 109 – 111) mathematician and scientist, Peter Stoner, applies the rules of probability to 48 of these prophecies. Telling us the chances of 48 being fulfilled are 1 in 10 to the 157 power – that is 1 in 10 with 157 zeros! Now if we only took eight of those prophecies, you have a number of 1 in 10 to the 17th power.

That is like stacking a heap of fifty-cent pieces a metre high all over NSW and then marking one with a red dot. Then blind fold a man, tell him he can travel as far as he wants but he can only pick up one fifty-cent piece and it must be the right one. Now if you were a gambling man would you bet all you have he would pick the right one? If you reject the Bible then you are making amore foolish bet.

The fact the Bible prophesies the future helps us understand:

- The only true God is the God of the Bible; all the other gods of the world are false (Isaiah 41:21-29).
- The only true prophets are the prophets of the Bible; all the other prophets are false (Deuteronomy 18:17-22).
- Whatever and/or whoever (including the Quran, Book of Mormon, Vedas, a vision, an angel, a priest, pope, pastor, so-called prophet, etc.) contradicts the words that have already been revealed in the Bible then they (the ones that contradict the Bible) are not of God (Deuteronomy 13:1-5; Isaiah 8:19-20; 2 Corinthians 11:1-4,13-15; Galatians 1:6-9).

If you desire victory over sin, self, society, and Satan then you must follow Jesus' example and use the sword in your spiritual battles (Matthew 4).

This means you will need to train with your sword daily; just like the knights of old did.

Conclusion: The word of God is supremely powerful and should take top priority in the life of every Christian.

You cannot please God until you know what He desires of you and you cannot know what He desires of you unless you read His word.

The Gospel of John is a good place for you to begin your DAILY reading. Once you have completed the book of John, you should read from Matthew (the first book of the New Testament) through Revelation (the last book of the Bible).

After you have completed reading the New Testament; read from Genesis (the first book of the Bible) through Malachi (the last book of the Old Testament). At that point, you will have read your Bible all the way through.

This worthy accomplishment will help you to grow and find true joy! You will therefore benefit from reading your Bible all the way through every year until the Lord takes you home to be with Him in glory!

LESSON 5: SPIRIT OF GOD

Study: John 14:15-18; 16:1-15

Introduction: One of the most misunderstood doctrines in the word of God is the doctrine of the Holy Ghost. Either He is mystified as an emotional influence causing irrational behaviour, or He is misunderstood as being unimportant in the life of a believer.

The passages above and the lesson below are given to teach you what the Bible says about the Holy Ghost in order to help you appreciate Him; and to encourage you to have a better relationship with Him.

So let us begin.

1. The Holy Ghost is a part of the Godhead.

The word “Godhead” is the biblical word for what we call “the Trinity”.

When we say God is a Trinity, we simply mean that there is only one God, but in the unity of the Godhead there are three, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost.

1 John 5:7 “For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one.”

The phrase “the Word” is a reference to Jesus Christ. We know this from John 1:1-18.

So the Bible teaches conclusively that there is a triune God. He is one, but He is three!

Now lest you think this is strange, weird, or illogical, I ask you to simply look all around you at the many examples in creation of the three in one.

For instance, think of how an egg has three parts (the shell, the white, and the yoke) but is still only one egg.

Think of water (H₂O), which comes in liquid form, solid form, and vapour form and yet is always water (H₂O).

Think of how time can be broken up into three parts (past, present, future) and yet all three are time. Think of how human beings have three parts (a body, soul, and spirit - 1 Thessalonians 5:23) that can and do separate, and yet are still only one being.

All of these examples and many more in creation attest to the fact that an entity can be three and yet one!

And so it is with God, there is only one God, yet in the unity of the Godhead there are three, one of whom is the Holy Ghost.

Further, it must be remembered that the Holy Ghost is not just an influence or feeling in our life, He is God whom we can grieve (Ephesians 4:30) and lie to (Acts 5:1-4).

2. The Holy Ghost lives within every saved individual.

If you are saved, the Holy Ghost is “in your body”. Through this indwelling, one is “born of the Spirit” (John 1:12-13; John 3:1-8; Ephesians 1:12-13; 1 Peter 1:18-19, 23).

Thus, every Christian has the Holy Ghost living in them.

1 Corinthians 6:19-20 “What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.”

1 Corinthians 3:16 “Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?”

Question 47. According to 1 Corinthians 3:16, where does the Spirit of God dwell? _____

If a person is saved then they have God’s Spirit in them. If a person does not have God’s Spirit in them, then they are not saved!

The following verse proves this:

Romans 8:9 “But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his.”

3. The works of the Holy Ghost.

- He **Comforts** (John 14:16, 18, 26; 16:7).

- He **Seals** (Ephesians 1:13, 14; 4:30).
- He **Assures** us of our salvation (Romans 8:15-16).

4. The fruit of the Holy Spirit.

Galatians 5:22-25 “But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.”

Every child of God is to have the above characteristics in their life. However, we cannot have these characteristics in our life if we do not willingly yield ourselves to God's will.

We have two natures within our body: one nature which desires to do wrong and another nature which desires to do right. If we are to live holy and experience the fruit of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, etc.) then we must not yield ourselves to the nature which desires to do wrong but rather yield ourselves to the nature which desires to do right.

We must live in the Spirit (letting the Holy Spirit direct and lead us) and then we will not fulfil the lust of the flesh.

Let us submit ourselves to God's will and we will enjoy being God's child.

Galatians 5:16 “This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.”

Question 50. According to Galatians 5:16, how can you keep yourself from fulfilling the lust of the flesh? _____

Romans 6:13 “Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto God.”

Romans 6:16 “Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?”

Romans 6:19 “I speak after the manner of men because of the infirmity of your flesh: for as ye have yielded your members servants to uncleanness and to iniquity unto iniquity; even so now yield your members servants to righteousness unto holiness”.

Conclusion: You got all of the Holy Ghost when you got saved (Romans 8:9), but it is up to you to give Him more of you.

Memorise: Ephesians 1:13

LESSON 6: SINFUL NATURE OF MAN

Study: Romans 7:14-25

Introduction: When you get saved you become a new creature in Christ with new desires. However, you still have the old sinful nature to deal with. That sinful nature is called “the old man”, “the flesh”, “the carnal man”, etc. This is why you still battle the desire to sin.

The battle to sin is a very real battle. A battle you will face and must fight until the day you go home (to heaven). It is a serious battle but it is a battle you can win. You can live in victory!

The passage above and the lesson below are designed to show you that you are not alone in this battle; you can live in victory.

After you have read and studied Romans 7, proceed with the lesson by studying the six steps you can take to live in victory over your sinful nature.

1. The first step to living in victory is daily confession of your sins.

Do not let sin or failure keep you down. You need to confess your sin and then get back up and try to do better next time. The Lord will forgive every sin you have ever committed, just be sure you get honest with God.

📖 1 John 1:9 “If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”

📖 Proverbs 28:13 “He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.”

Question 51. What must you do if you want to find forgiveness? _____

2. The second step to living in victory is to get rid of and stay away from any product, place, or person that tempts you to sin.

📖 Romans 13:14 “But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfil the lusts thereof.”

Question 52. What does it mean to not make provision for the flesh?

📖 Ephesians 4:27 “Neither give place to the devil”.

Question 53. What does it mean to not give place to the devil?

3. The third step to living in victory is to stay in the Bible and memorise it. The Bible will keep you from sin, or sin will keep you from the Bible.

📖 Psalms 119:9 “Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word.”

📖 Psalms 119:11 “Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee.”

Question 54. How can we hide God’s words in our hearts?

4. The fourth step to living in victory is to walk in the Spirit and get busy living for God every single day (Romans 6:11-13).

📖 Galatians 5:16 “This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.”

Question 55. What is something you can do to get busy for God?

5. The fifth step to living in victory is to pray to God on a regular basis.

🔪 Hebrews 4:15-16 “For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.”

When you feel tempted, go to Jesus in prayer and ask Him to help you fight the temptation. He knows and understands what you are going through because He also was tempted, yet without sin. Thus, He knows how to overcome temptation. So, ask for His help and do what He directs you to do.

Question 56. When you feel tempted to do wrong, what should you immediately do? _____

6. The sixth step to living in victory is to take God’s escape out of the temptation.

🔪 1 Corinthians 10:13 “There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it.”

God will give you a way to escape any temptation. It is up to you to look for the way of escape and take it.

The way to escape may be to read the Bible, or it may be to pray, or it may be to firmly resist and refuse it, or it may be to get up and leave (Genesis 39:2-12).

Question 57. Can you have victory over every temptation that comes your way? _____

Conclusion: Jesus Christ gave the victory and power over sin (1 Corinthians 15:56-58).

Reckon yourself dead indeed unto sin but alive unto God (Romans 6:6-14).

Claim the victory, be holy, and stay clean (1 Peter 1:15-16)!

LESSON 7: SANCTUARY OF GOD

Study: Hebrews 10:19-25

Introduction: If the Christian desires to be what they should be for God, then they should be involved in a local church.

As long as you are capable, being a part of a Bible-believing church is not a preference or option, but a command as shown in the passage above.

In this lesson we will look at three main points about the church.

1. The Making of the church (Matthew 16:13-18).

Question 58. According to Matthew 16:18, who will build the church?

Question 59. According to Matthew 16:18, what will Christ build His church upon? _____

Question 60. According to 1 Corinthians 10:4, who is the Rock?

Jesus Christ is the One who builds the church and He builds it upon Himself. He is the rock which the church is built upon (1 Peter 2:1-8).

2. The Members of the church.

To understand what the Bible teaches about the members of the church we must first understand what the church is. In the New Testament the word church is used in two main ways.

Sometimes the word church in the Bible is a reference to “The body of Christ” (Colossians 1:12-18, 24).

Question 62. According to Colossians 1:24, what is the church?

The way to get into the body is to be baptised by the Holy Spirit into the body of Christ—the church (1 Corinthians 12:13).

This is not being baptised in water but rather being baptised in the Spirit (Mark 1:8). This baptism takes place the very moment someone receives Christ as their personal Saviour, the moment when someone get saved as was taught in lesson 1 (see also John 3:1-6; 1:11-13; Ephesians 1:3-13; Romans 8:9).

The results of receiving Christ as Saviour are not hysterical actions but rather holy actions; for when someone receives Christ they become a new creature—a child of God (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Question 63. According to 1 Corinthians 12:13, are you baptised by the Spirit into the body of Christ? _____

So we see the word “Church” is sometimes simply a reference to the family of God; those who have been called out of their sins and into the Saviour. They are God’s children, saved by the blood of Christ, living no longer for their own glory but for the glory of God. They are the glorious church—the body and bride of Christ!

However, there is a second way the word “church” is used in Scripture.

Often the word “church” is simply talking about a local congregation in a certain geographical area which should be comprised of believers who have banded together for the purpose of glorifying their heavenly Father (Acts 9:31; 13:1; 14:23; 15:41; 1 Corinthians 16:1; 2 Corinthians 8:1-5; Revelation 1:4-6; etc.).

Most of the time, when the scriptures use the word “church” it is a reference to a local assembly.

God established local churches to handle his work on earth while Jesus is in heaven. The church is the means through which each believer can do their part in the body of Christ. Thus, the Bible puts great emphasis on true believers being a part of a local assembly.

The Bible makes clear that if you are saved then you need to find yourself a Bible believing local church where you can go and join yourself with (Acts 2:41-47; Acts 5:1-13; 1 Corinthians 1:10; Hebrews 10:19-25). This will benefit you, and help the body of Christ function better (1 Corinthians 12:22), and bring glory to God (Ephesians 3:14-21).

Question 64. According to 1 Corinthians 12:22, is every member of the church necessary? _____

If you are a member of the body of Christ then there is a certain place God desires you to be, so that the body may function properly.

Someone may be wondering, “How does someone join a local church?” The first thing is to pray and seek the will of God through His words (judging the churches you visit by the words of God; for just because a church claims to be of God does not mean it is). Once you think you have found the will of God you probably should go for a little while observing and praying for God to make it abundantly clear to you His will in regards to this church; for joining a church is an important commitment. Once you are sure of the will of God, you should go to the Pastor and tell him you want to join the local church.

After the Pastor has made sure of your salvation, separation, and seriousness to the best of his ability, he will guide you in the process of becoming a member of the local church.

Let us now look at the third point about the church.

3. The Mission of the church.

The Bible tells us in Revelation 4:10-11, Jesus has created all things for His pleasure. When the Bible says “all things” this would include the church. Therefore, the mission of the church is simple; to bring Jesus Christ pleasure.

The main job of the church is not to entertain man but rather to exalt the Saviour.

Question 65. According to Revelation 4:11, why have all things been created? _____

Let us look at some of the things which bring the Saviour pleasure.

- A. The Lord Jesus Christ is pleased when the church seeks to edify and equip its members to do the work of God (Ephesians 4:11-16).

The only way the church can accomplish the task of building its members into a strong body is by focusing on the preaching of the word of God, for it is the word of God that can build us up (Acts 20:32). Thus, there should be great emphasis placed on the teaching and preaching of the word of God.

Question 66. In Acts 20:32, what did Paul say was able to build up the believers? _____

- B. The Lord Jesus Christ is pleased when the church goes out into the world to reach unbelievers for Christ (Mark 16:14-15).

We are to be shining lights in this dark world, leading people to the Lord Jesus Christ (e.g. Mark 5:1-20).

- C. The Lord Jesus Christ is pleased when the church engages in the ordinances of God.

There are two main ordinances Jesus Christ commanded us to do; the Lord's Supper and Baptism.

Therefore, let us look at these two ordinances.

The first one is:

a. The Lord's Supper.

The Lord's Supper is a special Supper that Christ instituted for the church to do as often as God leads in order to remember Jesus' sacrifice and soon return.

1 Corinthians 11:23-26 "For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come."

Question 67. According to 1 Corinthians 11:23-25, who started the Lord's Supper? _____

Question 68. According to 1 Corinthians 11:24-25, why are we told to partake of the Lord's Supper? _____

Question 69. According to 1 Corinthians 11:26, what do you show when you eat the bread and drink the cup? _____

The reason we partake of the Lord's Supper is to remember what the Lord Jesus Christ did for us. The Lord's Supper is done as a memorial supper just like the Passover meal (Exodus 12:14). The Lord's Supper is a picture of Jesus's death.

The Lord's Supper consists of unleavened bread and the fruit of the vine (grape juice). The unleavened bread represents the body of Christ.

🔪 Luke 22:19 “And he took bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me.”

Question 70. According to Luke 22:19, what does the bread help us remember? _____

Since the bread used in the Lord's Supper represents the body of Christ, we should only use unleavened bread (1 Corinthians 5:6-8).

The reason we do not use leavened bread (e.g. scones, biscuits, etc.) is because in the Bible, leaven is often symbolic of sin (Matthew 16:6-12), and since the bread represents Christ's body which was without sin (1 Peter 2:21-22), then the bread must be without leaven (which is a picture of sin).

The cup we are to use should be of the fruit of the vine for that is what Jesus used (Matthew 26:26-29). Thus, we should use grape juice (Deuteronomy 32:14; Genesis 40:10-11).

Question 74. According to Matthew 26:29, what was in the cup?

Question 75. According to Deuteronomy 32:14, what is grape juice likened unto? _____

Now we are to partake of this bread and drink of this cup as the Lord leads us. The Bible does not give us a certain command as to how often we are to partake of the Lord's Supper. Thus, there is not a certain set program. The main thing is to not let the Lord's Supper become ritualistic but rather kept holy. Let us not make up rules but rather let God direct each individual church as he sees fit.

Question 76. Does the Bible give us a command as to how often we should take the Lord's Supper? _____

Now the last thing we want to show you about the Lord's Supper is the warnings God gives against partaking of the Lord's Supper with a wicked heart.

¶ 1 Corinthians 11:27-31 "Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep. For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged."

People who are not right with God should not partake of the Lord's Supper. If they do, God will judge them.

Therefore, you would be wise to take heed to the warning and "examine yourself". Do not treat the things of God lightly but rather come to Him in sincerity and truth.

- b. Now, let us look at the second ordinance God has given us, Water Baptism.

Now before we explain to you what water baptism is, let me explain to you what water baptism is not.

Water baptism is not in any shape, form, or fashion a means by which you can be saved from hell. A person can be baptised by one of the greatest men of God that has ever lived and still die and go to hell (e.g. Judas Iscariot).

Moreover, a person can never be baptised in water and still die and go to heaven (e.g. the thief on the cross spoken of in Luke 23:32-43).

Thus, it is clear that water baptism does not save a person from hell. The only baptism that will save a person from hell is the spiritual baptism that Jesus Christ gives to a person when they put their trust in him for salvation (Mark 1:6-8; Romans 6:3-5; 1 Corinthians 12:13).

Now since water baptism does not save a soul from hell, why should a person be baptised in water?

Well, a person should be baptised in water for three main reasons.

1. A person should be baptised in water because water baptism is a work someone can do that will please the Father.

In Matthew 28:19-20, the Lord Jesus made clear to his disciples that he desired them to baptise new believers in water.

Therefore, every time the Church scripturally baptises a person, they are attesting to the fact that Jesus Christ is the Saviour who died for our sins, was buried, rose again from the grave, and is coming again, and as such he is to be taken seriously and obeyed promptly. Thus, every time someone is baptised in water they are honouring the Son; and as such they are honouring the Father; and that my dear friend is reason enough to be baptised in water.

2. A person should be baptised in water because water baptism functions as a means by which someone can publically identify with the Saviour and God's people.

This is one of the reasons why John the Baptist came baptising. He came baptising to manifest Jesus Christ to Israel (John 1:31). When someone was baptised by John the Baptist it was a means by which someone identified with God's people—Israel, and as such with the coming Saviour. Well now that Jesus Christ has come, a person is now baptised in water to publically identify with the Saviour (who has come and is coming again) and with his people—the Church.

Water baptism is like a member of a sports team putting their jersey on so that everyone can know what team they play for. They are already on the team, but the jersey is a way by which everyone knows whose side they are on. Dear reader, if you are saved, you should willingly put your jersey on so that others can see you are a serious player on the team.

3. A person should be baptised in water to give a public testimony of their inward faith. When a person is saved they are spiritually crucified with Christ, buried with Christ, and then raised to walk in newness of life. Now since all of that takes place on the inside and no one can see it take place, a person is to be baptised in water as a public testimony of his or her inward faith. Water baptism is similar to a wedding ring. Just like a wedding ring is a picture of two people's commitment to one another, even so is water baptism a picture of a person's commitment to Christ.

As a side note, since water baptism is figure of the spiritual baptism that takes place when a person is saved, a person is to be baptised in water in such a way as to picture the fact that they have been "crucified with Christ" (that is why they are upright in the water), "buried with Christ" (that is why they are immersed into the water), and then "raised to walk in newness of life" (that is why they are raised out of the water).

Now let me give you one last thing about water baptism. Since water baptism pictures what takes place on the inside of a person that has believed on Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour, then water baptism should not be done until after someone receives Christ as their Saviour.

Acts 8:36-38 “And as they went on their way, they came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See, here is water; what doth hinder me to be baptized? And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him.”

So a person should not be baptised in water until after they have believed on the Lord Jesus Christ with all their heart. That means that no Church should ever baptise babies.

Water baptism is a wonderful picture of the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. It is a picture of being planted into the body of Christ and being raised to walk with the Lord. Therefore, every Christian, and only Christians, should willingly be scripturally baptised!

If you find a good church it will not only benefit you but it will also benefit the cause of Christ. So find a good church and enjoy living for God.

LESSON 8: SPENDING MONEY

Introduction: The passage above and the lesson below are designed to show you the responsibility you have regarding the spending of money.

1. Money and the church.

Genesis 28:20-22 “And Jacob vowed a vow, saying, If God will be with me, and will keep me in this way that I go, and will give me bread to eat, and raiment to put on, So that I come again to my father's house in peace; then shall the LORD be my God: And this stone, which I have set for a pillar, shall be God's house: and of all that thou shalt give me I will surely give the tenth unto thee.”

Then the chief of the fathers and princes of the tribes of Israel, and the captains of thousands and of hundreds, with the rulers of the king's work, offered willingly, And gave for the service of the house of God of gold five thousand talents and ten thousand drams, and of silver ten thousand talents, and of brass eighteen thousand talents, and one hundred thousand talents of iron. And they with whom *precious* stones were found gave *them* to the treasure of the house of the LORD, by the hand of Jehiel the Gershonite. Then the people rejoiced, for that they offered willingly, because with perfect heart they offered willingly to the LORD: and David the king also rejoiced with great joy. Wherefore David blessed the LORD before all the congregation: and David said, Blessed *be* thou,

LORD God of Israel our father, for ever and ever. Thine, O LORD, *is* the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty: for all *that is* in the heaven and in the earth *is thine*; thine *is* the kingdom, O LORD, and thou art exalted as head above all. Both riches and honour *come* of thee, and thou reignest over all; and in thine hand *is* power and might; and in thine hand *it is* to make great, and to give strength unto all. Now therefore, our God, we thank thee, and praise thy glorious name. But who *am* I, and what *is* my people, that we should be able to offer so willingly after this sort? for all things *come* of thee, and of thine own have we given thee.”

Acts 20:35 “I have shewed you all things, how that so labouring ye ought to support the weak, and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive.”

2 Corinthians 9:6-7 “But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully. Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver.”

2. Money and sin.

a. It is a sin to love money.

1 Timothy 6:9-10 “But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.”

In the above passage, God is not saying it is wrong to get rich through labour. Instead, He is warning about labouring for the wrong motives.

1 Timothy 5:8 “But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.”

Introduction: The Bible does not leave any area of our lives untouched with its principles of truth and direction. Thus, the Bible has much to say about how we work, where we work, and when we work.

Therefore, this lesson is designed to teach you some basic truths in regards to your responsibility at work.

1. **Do your best to do a good job for your employer, remembering you represent Christ.**

Colossians 3:22-24 “Servants, obey in all things your masters according to the flesh; not with eyeservice, as menpleasers; but in singleness of heart, fearing God: And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men; Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ.”

Ecclesiastes 9:10 “Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest.”

2. **Do not steal from your employer.**

This includes your employer’s things and time. Thus, when you are getting paid to work you should work.

Titus 2:9-10 “Exhort servants to be obedient unto their own masters, and to please them well in all things; not answering again; Not purloining (purloining means stealing), but shewing all good fidelity (fidelity means faithfulness); that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things.”

3. Be careful about talking about other peoples’ affairs at work.

1 Thessalonians 4:11 “And that ye study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you;”

2 Thessalonians 3:11-12 “For we hear that there are some which walk among you disorderly, working not at all, but are busybodies. Now them that are such we command and exhort by our Lord Jesus Christ, that with quietness they work, and eat their own bread.”

For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto holiness.”

As we begin to study the prophecies in the Bible we begin to see the main focus is the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. This event is at the centre of Biblical prophecies. In this study, let us look at some things which every Christian should be doing when they know the wonderful reality of our Lord's soon return.

1. We should proclaim His coming.

a. Angels proclaimed it.

Acts 1:11 “Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven.”

Watch ye therefore: for ye know not when the master of the house cometh, at even, or at midnight, or at the cockcrowing, or in the morning: Lest coming suddenly he find you sleeping. And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch.”

Blessed are those servants, whom the lord when he cometh shall find watching: verily I say unto you, that he shall gird himself, and make them to sit down to meat, and will come forth and serve them. And if he shall come in the second watch, or come in the third watch, and find them so, blessed are those servants. And this know, that if the goodman of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched, and not have suffered his house to be broken through. Be ye therefore ready also: for the Son of man cometh at an hour when ye think not.”

LESSON 12: STUDY OF THE FUTURE (PART 2)

Introduction: In this final lesson we shall look at the events which shall happen in the near future and the order each one roughly occurs.

However, before we begin to look at each event separately, we shall give a brief overview of the coming future.

When God first made mankind, He made them innocent. However, they soon sinned and fell from innocence and dove into iniquity. As man began to multiply upon the face of the earth they became more and more wicked as the years went by, until eventually, the Bible says that GOD saw that the wickedness of man *was* great in the earth, and *that* every imagination of the thoughts of his heart *was* only evil continually. The world had become vile and wretched, with men claiming to be their own god, doing that which was right in their own eyes; and thus the world was filled with violence, fornication, and mysticism; and very few people cared to know anything about the one true God of the Bible. However, there were a few.

One of the men who cared about God was a man named Enoch. Enoch was a man who walked with God in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation. A man who stood for principle and righteousness. A man who loved God above popularity, money, prestige, or power. Enoch was a good man who had a great great grandson, named Noah.

As the years kept passing from Enoch to Noah, the world kept getting worse, but Enoch continued walking with God in spite of the wickedness. God loved Enoch and Enoch loved God. God began to reveal to Enoch that he was getting tired of the world's wickedness and would soon execute judgment upon all. Enoch began to preach of the coming judgment but was laughed to scorn, but Enoch did not falter, he continued to walk with God. One day as God and Enoch were fellowshiping, God translated Enoch out of the wicked world and into

heaven. When this happened, people began to look for Enoch as they wondered what happened to him, but they could not find him, for God had taken him.

As time went on, the world continued to reject God's ways and turned everyone to their own way. Thus, as the days went by, the world grew worse. Now as God looked upon this world with its violence, fornication, mockery, and mysticism, He got angry and decided it was time for him to bring down His wrath upon an unbelieving and unrighteous world by way of a worldwide flood. However, due to God's mercy and grace, before He did this, He looked for a man whom He could use to preserve life, and He found such a man—Noah! Noah was a man who loved God and wanted to serve God; and so Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord and was thus commissioned to build an ark in order to preserve life upon the world.

It took Noah several years to build an ark. During that time, Noah preached righteousness but none except his wife, and his sons and their wives would listen. Therefore, after Noah built the ark and God loaded it up with the life He wanted to preserve, God brought down His wrath upon a wicked and hell-deserving world; and all were doomed except for those inside the ark.

Now I reminded you of all that because the Bible tells us that the last days will be like it was as in the days of Noah.

Just like in the days of Noah, the world continued to refuse the truth and turn their ears unto fables, living as though they were their own god and king, so too will it be in the last days. Moreover, just like the days of Noah were filled with mockery, violence, fornication, and mysticism, so too will it be in the last days. Further, just like God got fed up with the wickedness and brought His wrath upon the unbelieving world in the days of Noah, so too will it be in the last days. God is going to get fed up with this world and will thus bring His wrath upon

it, rooting out of His land all the rebellious souls who reject the truth! However, there are some things that will take place before He brings His wrath out upon the world, for just like there was in the days of Noah, so too in the last days, there shall be a remnant that loves and lives for God! That brings us to the first major event of the future.

1. **The Translation.**

The very next major event that will affect the whole church is what is referred to as ‘The Translation’, or as some people call it, ‘The Rapture’.

As we said above, the world is destined to get more and more wicked. So much so that eventually God is going to get fed up with the vileness of the world and He is going to pour out His wrath upon the world as we know it.

However, just like there was in the days of Noah, there will be people like Enoch, who know God, people whom God will translate out of this world before He pours His wrath out on the world, for these people are not appointed to wrath but rather to obtain salvation by our Lord Jesus Christ.

¶ Romans 5:6-9 “For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. For scarcely for a righteous man will one die: yet peradventure for a good man some would even dare to die. But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him.”

The way God saves the church from this terrible time, known as the time of Jacob’s trouble, is by transporting them from earth to heaven.

The church is going to be translated out of this world before God brings His wrath upon the world just like Enoch was translated before God poured out His wrath upon the pre-flood generation.

Genesis 5:21-24 “And Enoch lived sixty and five years, and begat Methuselah: And Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years, and begat sons and daughters: And all the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty and five years: And Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God took him.”

This brings up the next event to take place in the future:

2. The Judgment Seat of Christ.

After the church is translated into Heaven the world is cast into the time of Jacob’s trouble and the church is brought before God to give an account and be judged for what they had done whilst on the earth.

This judgment of the saints is called “the judgment seat of Christ”.

There are three main passages which deal with this event. These passages are listed below.

Romans 14:10-12 “But why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother? for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God.”

Note: The fire in this passage is the eyes of Jesus (Revelation 2:18) which Jesus uses to carefully examine our works.

When a person gets saved, they are taken out of the miry clay, set upon a rock (Psalm 40:1-2), and put into the body of Christ (the church) by the Spirit of God.

After that happens, the Christian then begins to build on the foundation. The good things built on the foundation are likened unto gold, silver, and precious stones whilst the bad things built upon the foundation are likened unto wood, hay, and stubble.

One day God will call forth every Christian to the Judgment Seat of Christ in order to look at how the Christian has built upon the foundation they were placed upon. At that judgment, Jesus Christ will take his eyes of fire (Revelation 2:18) and examine the Christian's works. Every work that the Christian has done that survives the fire will result in the Christian receiving a reward; whilst every work that is burned up by the fire will result in the Christian suffering loss.

Now there is no doubt that judgment may be uncomfortable for some of us, yet there is also no doubt that every Christian will make it through the judgment and enter into heaven (see 1 Corinthians 3:15). Furthermore, there is also no doubt that every Christian will get some kind of reward from God (1 Corinthians 4:5).

Our God is a wonderful and gracious God who is looking to bless us, not blast us. Thus, we surely should desire to keep ourselves in the love of God so that we might please Him.

For consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself, lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds.”

1 John 2:28 “And now, little children, abide in him; that, when he shall appear, we may have confidence, and not be ashamed before him at his coming.”

2 John 1:8 “Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.”

Jude 1:21 “Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life.”

Are you laying up treasure in heaven? Are you working for our Lord? Are you walking holy for our Lord? Are you watching for our Lord? Are you patiently waiting for our Lord? Be ye ready for in such an hour as ye think not the son of man cometh.

That concludes our study about the Judgment Seat of Christ. We are now ready for the next event on God’s timetable.

3. The time of Jacob’s trouble.

Whilst the church is being judged at the judgment seat of Christ to see what rewards they will receive or lose, the world is being judged for their rejection of Christ and the Jews are being prepared for their coming King by purging out the rebels and purifying the elect.

This time of retribution and purging is known as “the time of Jacob’s trouble”. The reason it is called the time of Jacob’s trouble is because it is when the Lord turns His attention back to Israel (called Jacob in the Bible) and prepares them for their coming Messiah.

In this study let us consider: The Coming of Jacob’s trouble, the Character of Jacob’s trouble, and the Cause of Jacob’s trouble.

Let us begin by first looking at the Coming of Jacob’s trouble.

God promised in the scriptures that He would bless Israel, give them the land of Canaan, and reign over them as their great King. Therefore, since God always keeps His promises, He must bless Israel. However, they cannot be blessed until they are on blessing ground. Thus, God sends the time of Jacob’s trouble to prepare Israel (Jacob) for her coming King (Study Jeremiah 30:1-7; Ezekiel 20:30-38; Zechariah 13:7-9; and Matthew 24:1-28).

From these references we see the coming of the time of Jacob's trouble is sure and something that has to do with the Jewish people.

It is a judgment which Israel must pass through as a refining process in order to prepare them for the blessings God has for them.

This judgment, this refining process, will last for seven years. We know this by studying Daniel 9:20-27.

In Daniel 9:20-27; the prophet Daniel has a vision about God's working with Israel. In this vision God shows him there are seventy weeks determined upon Israel. In verse 25 the Lord makes clear to Daniel that it would be 69 weeks from the going forth of the command "to restore and rebuild Jerusalem unto Messiah the Prince".

"The Messiah the Prince" is none other than the Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, if we were to add 69 weeks from the date when the commandment to rebuild and restore Jerusalem was given, we would come up with the date the Messiah shows up.

When we study Daniel 9:20-27, we need to understand each week stands for seven years. Therefore the 69 weeks equal a total of 483 years. It was exactly 483 years of 360 days, from the going forth of the commandment to rebuild and restore Jerusalem unto Jesus showing up riding into Jerusalem being hailed as the promised Son of David (this was proven beyond any doubt by a man named Sir. Robert Anderson).

It was at this time, the Jews had Jesus crucified. Thus, the weeks prophesied by Daniel stopped, and the remaining one week (the seventieth week) was left to be fulfilled.

The reason the weeks stopped was because the seventy weeks deal with the Israelites not the Gentiles (Daniel 9:20, 24).

During the break between the sixty-ninth and seventieth week, the Holy Spirit is gathering out the church. When the gathering is complete, the church will be taken away, and then God's clock in relation to Israel will start to tick again.

It is during this last week (Daniel's seventieth week) that the time of Jacob's trouble is to occur, and as the weeks of the already fulfilled sixty-nine weeks were each seven years in length, so this last, or seventieth week, must be the same-seven years.

The length then of Jacob's trouble will be seven years. This last week (seventieth week) is when the prince (Satan) makes a covenant of peace of one week (7 years) with the Jews. He does this through the antichrist. The antichrist is the man who comes in on a white horse signifying peace in Revelation 6:1-2.

However, the antichrist breaks the covenant in the middle of the week (Daniel 9:27). Thus, the last half of this week (three and a half years) is most dreadful for the Jewish people (Daniel 12:7, 11; Revelation 11:2; 12:6; 13:5; Matthew 24:1-28).

Now that we have determined the length of Jacob's trouble, let us study the contents of Jacob's trouble. To do this we must study the breaking of the seals, the sounding of the trumpets, and the pouring out of the vials as described in Revelation 6-19 for God uses these events as the pre-lude to the judgments of the time of Jacob's trouble.

So let us now begin:

A. The Seals.

1. **The First Seal** (Study: Revelation 6:1-2).

A white horse appears, the rider of which is uncrowned at first, but is afterward crowned. He has an arrowless bow in his hand, and goes forth conquering. This rider is not Christ. Christ comes on a white horse with many crowns already on His head and a sharp sword coming out of His mouth as His weapon (Revelation 19).

This rider is the antichrist (the one who mimics Christ in order to deceive and destroy). The white horse and the arrowless bow represent him conquering the world through peace and prosperity (Daniel 8:23-25).

The white horse rider (the antichrist) will conquer the world by a peaceful take over. He will make seemingly “peace” by creating a seven year covenant with Israel (Daniel 9:24-27) and a prosperous global economy fuelled by a global monetary system (Revelation 13:16-18).

In this first glimpse into the time of Jacob’s trouble we see there will arise a world leader who will be able to create a seemingly prosperous and peaceful society. But...when they begin to say peace and safety, sudden destruction will come upon them.

1 Thessalonians 5:3 “For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape.”

This is when the second seal is opened.

2. **The Second Seal** (Study: Revelation 6:3-4).

The symbolism is clear. Red, the colour of the horse, is a symbol of blood, whilst the sword is symbolic of war. This time was clearly prophesied by Christ in Matthew 24:6-7. When this seal is opened, peace is taken from the world.

Matthew 24:6-7 “And ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: and there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places.”

After the peace is taken away from the world another seal is opened which reveals to us some of the effects of peace being taken from the world.

3. **The Third Seal** (Study: Revelation 6:5-6).

According to Matthew 20:2; if a man worked for one whole day he got a penny. Thus, during the time of Jacob’s trouble, a person will work all day for a bare minimum of food.

The black horse rider of which holds a pair of scales in his hand and a voice cries, "A measure of wheat for a penny, and three measures of barley for a penny; and see thou hurt not the oil and the wine." Famine will surely arise due to the effects of war. This is exactly what Christ prophesied in Matthew 24:7 when He told them there would be famines and pestilences.

Due to the war and famine, death begins to overtake the earth. This is when we are introduced to the fourth seal.

4. **The Fourth Seal** (Study: Revelation 6:7-8).

When the fourth seal is opened, over a fourth part of the earth is killed. If we use today's population as a guide that would mean almost two billion being people killed.

After the war, famine, and slaughter of so many people, the world begins to blame the believers for their problems and thus begin to slaughter them by the multitudes. This introduces us to the next seal.

5. **The Fifth Seal** (Study: Revelation 6:9-11).

When the Fifth Seal is broken John sees the "souls of martyrs" under the Altar. These martyrs are those who will be killed for the "word of their Testimony, and who love not their lives unto the death"

(Revelation 12:11). This matches exactly the words of our Lord Jesus Christ in Matthew 24:9.

Matthew 24:9 “Then shall they deliver you up to be afflicted, and shall kill you: and ye shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake.”

It is the “souls” of the martyrs of this persecution that John saw under the altar. These martyrs asked that their deaths should be avenged, but were told to rest for a “little season” until they were joined by their fellow servants and brethren who should die as they did. The promise is fulfilled in Revelation 20:4.

Revelation 20:4 “And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years.”

After the crowds begin to persecute the believers, I believe God gets angry. Thus, he begins to shake the world. This shaking happens at the sixth seal.

6. **The Sixth Seal** (Study: Revelation 6:12-17).

When the sixth seal is opened a great earthquake will shake the world and cause all kinds of astronomical phenomenon to occur.

7. **The Seventh Seal** (Study: Revelation 8:1-2).

At the breaking of the seventh seal there will be silence in Heaven for a limited period. This will be a period of preparation for the greater conflict to follow.

Following the silence, seven angels in succession sound upon seven trumpets.

B. The Trumpets.

1. **The First Trumpet** (Study: Revelation 8:7).

The first trumpet will cause hail and fire mingled with blood to be cast upon the earth. This will result in one third of all trees and all green grass to be burned up. This will be a time of major bush fires (Revelation 8:7).

This will be a fulfilment of Joel 2:30-31. This is a repetition of the seventh Egyptian plague (Exodus 9:22-24).

2. **The Second Trumpet** (Study: Revelation 8:8-9).

When the second trumpet sounds, something as a burning mountain will fall into the sea. This event will result in a third part of the creatures of the sea and a third part of the ships to be destroyed. The blood of the destroyed will cause a third part of the sea to be discoloured.

3. **The Third Trumpet** (Study: Revelation 8:10-11).

When the third trumpet sounds a great burning star, called Wormwood, will fall from the heavens and poison the streams of fresh waters causing many men to die from the bitterness of the water (Jeremiah 9:13-15).

When the fifth trumpet sounds, a star will fall from Heaven to the earth and will be given the key of the bottomless pit.

When the bottomless pit is opened, a smoke as the smoke of a great furnace arises out of the pit. Out of the smoke comes forth locusts upon the earth.

The locusts will be shaped like horses prepared unto battle; and on their heads will be as it were crowns like gold, and their faces will be as the faces of men, and they have hair as the hair of women, and teeth as the teeth of lions.

They have breastplates as breastplates of iron and the sound of their wings will be as the sound of chariots of many horses running to battle. They have tails with stingers in them like scorpions whose sting will torment men for five months.

The torment caused by these locusts will be so great upon those who rejected the truth they will be begging to die but death will flee from them.

These locusts are not ordinary locusts but rather some kind of spiritual beings.

The world is full of people who are filled with unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, envy, murder, deceit, backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, covenant breakers, unmerciful people, and lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God.

They despise and mock God, His words and people and call it enlightenment. They kill babies and call it women's rights. They corrupt little children and call it sex education. They parade nudity and vulgarity and call it art. They persecute Christians by passing laws against our freedom of speech and call it tolerance.

This world is anti-Bible, anti-holiness, and anti-God. They treat Christ, His creation, church, and children with despite, but one day, the Lord will repay!

4. The Revelation (Study: Revelation 16:12-16).

The Revelation is when Jesus comes back down to the earth and rescues Israel.

We call this the Revelation because it is at this time Jesus Christ is revealed to the world as the King of kings and Lord of lords.

After this time every knee will bow to Him, either in defeat or in honour, and He will be crowned as King of the universe. He will accomplish His take-over by one of the bloodiest battles the world has ever seen. That battle is called Armageddon.

At this point we will look at the Reason of Armageddon, the Redeemed who come with the Lord, and the Result of Armageddon.

A. The Reason of Armageddon.

At the Revelation, Jesus Christ is going to come with vengeance in his eyes in order to rescue Israel and reveal to the world he is King of kings.

The Lord shall bring down all the high looks of mankind and they shall bow before Him and confess His name as Lord of lords and King of kings.

After the Lord sets up His throne in Jerusalem we enter the blessed time known as “The Millennial Reign of Christ”.

5. The Millennial Reign of Christ.

After the battle of Armageddon we are ushered into one of the most blessed times the earth has ever seen. It is the time of the millennial reign of Christ.

Revelation chapter twenty makes it abundantly clear this time will last for one thousand years (this is why we call it “the millennial reign of Christ”).

This one thousand year reign will be a time of perfect peace, prosperity, security, righteousness, justice, environmental balance, etc. It will be a very special and glorious time upon the earth.

- g. The people who come out of the time of Jacob's trouble will reproduce during this time (Ezekiel 47:22-23; Zechariah 8:1-8).
- h. Everyone will worship and magnify the Lord Jesus Christ during this time or else be punished (Zechariah 14:1-21; Isaiah 66:5-24).
